For many people in the world, walking miles while carrying heavy jugs of water, in order to make sure they have clean water, is a daily task. Many missionaries constantly run the risk of contracting a disease or parasites from the water in the countries they serve.

For example, Larry and Sally are missionaries serving in Africa. Larry is a physician and knows how important safe drinking water is. He says "Every day, I see and treat children and adults who are suffering from bad water. Some end up dying."

A sad reality is that it can be prevented. In 2016, filters for missionaries and grants for wells were given to assist with clean projects in Indonesia and Haiti.

#### Ministry Highlight - CFBC Medical Committee



The purpose of the Medical Assistance Committee at CFBC is to assist individuals with acute medical needs during church activities and events. This committee consists of persons who have a medical background with some degree of medical training. Many of our members are physicians, nurses and

EMTs who work as first responders. While we are not a stand-alone clinic, we are equipped to handle issues that range from basic medical emergencies to simple personal needs. For major medical issues, we stabilize patients as much as possible and call 911. Each person in need is evaluated and treated on a case-by-case basis. In addition to addressing acute medical issues, we offer free blood pressure screenings during our annual church festival and have trained our nursing staff in basic CPR.

We are hoping to provide a training course that will be open to the entire congregation. We also foresee future plans to provide seminars on health education topics that are of greatest concern to our congregation. The health of our congregation is our top priority. We invite anyone with a medical background and a willing heart to serve, to come join our committee. Please let us know if we can be of service in any way.
